**Providing Healthcare Transportation**  
***Alpine Ballroom A- 4/25 at 10:00 AM***

This session will provide information on successful healthcare transportation programs and the Riverside Rides to Wellness projects.

This presentation will introduce the Blythe Wellness Express, a pilot NEMT project for long-distance medical trips, designed to be responsive to health care outcomes of interest to FTA's Rides to Wellness program for/in a rural, medically-disadvantaged and underserved community. This project was selected for funding during the first R2W cycle to provide currently non-existent non-emergency health care transportation from rural Blythe, CA to the Coachella Valley, nearly 100 miles away.

The project features considerable community partnership lead by the Riverside County Transportation Commission and a small rural operator (PVVTA) as sub-recipient. It follows the design of similar and successful long-distance non-emergency medical transportation services. A three-tiered health outcomes evaluation is a unique feature of this transportation project, designed to track participants over time to demonstrate improved access to care and resultant improved compliance with treatment program. Selected measures will help to report on FTA's interest in improved health care outcomes as self-reported by participants, through reductions in emergency visits and hospital re-admissions, and in reduced healthcare costs. Presenters will describe the R2W grant application process, including identifying the health care need when limited data exists, developing community and hospital partnerships in this rural setting; designing the project; and preparing for the planned July 2017 project launch.

Using those states as guides, our team is currently developing initial draft funding evaluation criteria to guide development of future 5311(f) funding metrics in California. **Shared Use Mobility Programs**

*Alpine Ballroom A-4/26 at 9:40 a.m.*

Several forms of shared-use mobility programs will be discussed in this CalACT session and have been briefly defined below. Carsharing allows people to rent cars on a short-term (hourly or daily), as-needed basis, paying only for the time they use the car and the mileage they drive. The operators of the car-sharing program provide vehicle maintenance, repair, and insurance.

Shared-use vehicles allow individuals to gain the benefits of using a private car without the costs and responsibilities of owning a car. Members of a shared-use vehicle or car sharing program pick-up and return vehicles at shared use lots that are scattered throughout a particular region or concentrated at a transit station, activity or employment center. Typically, a member makes a reservation in advance, lets him or herself into the vehicle with a personal card or key, and drives away. When the person is done using the car, she returns the car to its home parking space, locks it, and leaves it for the next car sharer.

This particular CalACT session will be examining the various way, which these mobility options can be incorporated by public transit agencies and city run transportation programs to the benefit of their passengers and constituents. As the diversity of the speaking panel below suggests, this session will be examining the deployment of car sharing programs and other shared use mobility options with a kaleidoscopic lens and a plurality of perspectives. During this session, the panelists will be discussing the various forms of shared-use mobility and the methodologies and stratagems that have guided the deployment of these kinds of programs to provide transportation options for seniors, individuals with disabilities, and individuals who are economically insolvent.
